CRT is Fast Approaching

Lincoln Schools is getting ready for this year's CRT (Criterion Reference Test) testing cycle. Grades 3-8 and grade 10 will be given the assessment. The school is asking for your help during these testing periods. We would like the students to view this process as a positive experience. Please talk to your child about how to prepare for testing and the benefits of testing by reviewing the following with your child. 1.) Attendance is very important during the testing time as it is difficult for the students to

make up tests that they miss. 2.) Get plenty of rest. 3.) Eat a good breakfast/lunch 4.) Know that some questions will be easy, some right at their ability level, and some that will be difficult. Encourage them to make the best choice that they can. 5.) Follow the teacher's directions. Fill in the bubbles completely and do not make

any marks on the booklets. 6.) Bring a reading book with you. When you finish, you may read while others finish their test.
